













## GUIDELINE FOR DETERMINING THE RARITY OF A SOG KNIFE

Scale	Description	
10	<b>EXTRAORDINARY.</b> Serialized production less than 200, exceptionally unique, custom 1 of 1 models. Can be unknown to experienced collectors.	
9	<b>SPECIALTY/UNIQUE.</b> Serialized/limited edition production of 500 or less and prototypes.	
8	<b>VERY SCARCE.</b> Production limited to 1,000 or less. Typically only available from experienced collectors.	
7	<b>SCARCE.</b> Typically only available from collectors.	
6	<b>LIMITED DISCONTINUED.</b> Limited availability online, at shows, or between collectors.	
5	<b>DISCONTINUED.</b> Only available online.	
4	<b>UNCOMMON.</b> Discontinued. Difficult to find even at large retailers and online.	
3	<b>COMMON.</b> Currently in production. Only available at retailers with overstock.	
2	<b>LESS COMMON.</b> Currently in production. Limited availability at many retail sources.	
1	<b>VERY COMMON.</b> Currently in production. Easily available from multiple retail sources.	

Note. RARITY <> VALUABLE. For example, a "10-Extraordinary" rare knife doesn't mean it's more valuable than a "8-Very Scarce" knife. A good example of SOG Knives would be a Rarity 10 factory custom Stingray knife with deer antler scales in comparison to a Rarity 8 Midnite Tigershark. The Midnite Tigershark is clearly more valuable.
